Rules & Guidelines

- Entry Fee is **\$5 per person**. Number of entries per person are unlimited.
- Academic eligibility <u>will not</u> be verified, following TEA /TAPPS guidelines, as applicable to all competing in
 4-H events in Cooke Count. The contest is taking place during a school holiday, so there is no need.

Age Divisions are as follows: Senior: 9th, 10th, 11th & 12th Grades (High School)

Intermediate: 6th, 7th & 8th Grades

Junior: 3rd, 4th & 5th Grades

Clover: age 5 & in Kindergarten, 1st & 2nd Grade

- First, Second and Third place ribbons will be given in each class and other awards will be given
- This event will count as a ribbon activity toward the Achievement Banquet
- Classes with subdivisions will be divided only if there are 2 or more for that division, otherwise they can be grouped together under the main category (Example: Cookies—drop, sliced, shaped or rolled)
- All entries must have been completed since the 2021 Creative Arts Showcase
- Project displays must be submitted on full -sized tri-fold display boards. See the 2021-2022 Texas 4-H Project List for ideas in each of the classes in this category.
- Food Art—entries in which all visible decorations & embellishments must be of food grade
- Story Card—for entries that require this, please explain on a typed 8 1/2" x 11" piece of paper how you designed your project. i.e. Trash to Treasure category—talk about the "trash" you chose, why you chose it and what inspired you to turn it into a treasure. i.e. Food Art category—talk about your inspiration that gave you your idea and how you created your food art, including what types of food was used in the decorating/creative process
- Photography must be flush mounted on foam board, must be 8 x 10" in size
- This is the qualifying contest for the State 4-H Photography Contest for Senior aged (grades 9-12) 4-H members. Guidelines for the State 4-H Photography Contest must be followed and can be found online at this link:

Category: CULINARY CREATIONS

- Each entry MUST have the recipe included on an index card Do not include participant's name on recipe. This includes pie crusts, pastries, fillings or frostings.
- All food items must be in a clear bag or container. No cardboard Bakery boxes.
- Entries that require refrigeration will not be accepted. This
 includes Cool Whip, Whipped Cream, Cream Pies, Cheesecake, etc. Cream cheese icing is acceptable
- All garnishes and decorations must be edible. No Fresh fruit
- Mixes are allowed in cookies, bar cookies & creative cakes
 ONLY
- Decorated cakes are in Food Art, Class #20 in Crafts

Culinary Creations Classes

- 103. Cookies Drop, sliced, shaped or rolled-6 on a plate
- 104. Bar Cookies- 6 on a plate
- 105. Scratch Cakes Frosting not required, single or multi layer
- 106. Creative Cakes Cakes made with a mix, with ingredients added other than those listed on the box. Frosting is not required.
- 107. Cupcakes 6 regular size cupcakes
- 108. Cake Balls/ Cake Pops 6 balls/pops
- 109. Quick Breads standard size loaf

Texas 4-H Photography Contest 2021-2022 Categories

It is extremely important that 4-H members, project leaders, parents, and County Extension Agents review the descriptions of each category very carefully. Do not enter photographs into categories that are duplicates from other categories or ones that do not clearly meet the category description. Photographs that do not meet the description of the category will be disqualified.

ANIMALS - DOMESTIC

Photos focusing on the various animals that have been tamed and made fit for a human environment. To be considered domesticated, the animal must have their behavior, life cycle, or physiology systemically altered as a result of being under human control for many generations.

Examples: Chickens, cows, dogs, cats, hamsters, horses, pigs, sheep, goats, etc. All waterfowl (ducks and geese) should be entered in Animals - Wildlife.

ANIMALS - WILDLIFE

Category focuses on animals not typically tamed or domesticated and commonly found in the wilderness or bodies of water throughout the country and world. Photos can be of wildlife in nature, zoos, and/or petting zoos.

Examples: Birds, deer, elephants, snakes, whales, etc.

CATCH-ALL (Revised)

Photos that do not fit into one of the other categories.

Not allowed: A duplicate photo also entered in another category.

DETAILS & MACRO

Getting in close is the name of the game for this category. The goal is to zoom in close on an object to see its finer details or to make small objects appear life-sized or larger that we do not normally get to see with the naked eye.

Examples: Insect eyes, veins on a leaf, a reflection in a water droplet, etc.

ELEMENTS OF DESIGN

Images use of graphic elements of design. Photos that showcase line, shape, pattern, form, texture, perspective, etc. Photo can consist of any subject matter.

Examples: Line, pattern, perspective, shape, etc.

Not allowed: Digital creations or graphic designs made in software such as Photoshop, InDesign or Illustrator.

ENHANCED

A single photo that has been technically manipulated to be an abstract, panoramic, stitched or composite image. Others variations are allowed as well.

Examples: Software edited composites and creations, images greatly manipulated with a variety of filters, photos with artistic borders, photos stitched into a panoramic, etc.

FOOD

A still life specialization of photography, aimed at producing attractive photographs of food for use in such items of advertisements, packaging, menus and/or cookbooks.

Examples: Cakes/pies, Easter eggs, fruits and place settings, ingredients, sandwiches, Thanksgiving dinner, etc.

Not allowed: A photo of alcohol beverages.

LANDSCAPE & NATURE (NON-ANIMAL)

The focus of this category includes landscapes, outdoor scenics, nature images, sunsets, urban landscapes, seascapes, cityscapes, and farms. Images focus on the beauty of the outdoors.

Examples: Gardens/landscapes, outdoors, scenics, etc. **Not allowed:** Primary subject is a person or wildlife.

LEADING LINE

This image composition technique features lines that draw the viewer's eye from point A to point B, which is the primary subject. **Example:** A river that begins in the foreground and draws your attention to a photogenic bridge in the background.

LONG EXPOSURE

Also known as time-exposure or slow-shutter, this technique involves using a long-duration shutter speed. It can be used to sharply capture stationary elements of an image while blurring, smearing, or obsuring the moving elements. It is also used in low-light conditions.

Examples: fireworks, moving water, light trails, Milky Way, light painting, night or low-light conditions, etc.

MOTION/ACTION

The capture of movement within a single photo. The subject appears stopped or "frozen".

Examples: Ferris wheel spinning, sporting events, horse running across a field, etc.

PEOPLE

Photos focus from all walks of life, parenting and family, children, babies, models/fashion, sports, and couples. All individuals in the photos must have provided consent and permission as a subject. If requested, a release will be needed from the photographer and subject.

Examples: Babies, families, kids, portraits, models/fashion, etc.

PLANT/FLORA

Photos of interesting, unique, and beautiful flowers and flora. Photography can occur outdoors or indoors. Photo subject should be that of a <u>single</u> flower, plant, bush, tree, etc. Large collections of plant/flora should be considered for entry into the Landscape & Nature category.

Examples: A rose, an upward shot of a tree, etc.

SHADOW/SILHOUETTE

A silhouette is an outline that appears dark (typically a single color) with little or no details/features against a brighter background. Recording patterns of light and shade for a desired effect or emphasis is the definition of a shadow. The silhouette or shadow must be the primary subject and focus of the image.

Examples: shadows/silhouettes of people, plants, animals, structures, architectures, or natural structures.

Not allowed: reflections

THEME (New)

The 2021-2022 theme is "My Hometown". Show what is special, iconic, unique, or even quirky about your hometown. Capture what makes it exceptional, historic, fun, or simply the best place to grow up.

Examples: statue, an old home, cityscape, natural area, town square, the barber shop, etc.

Creative Arts Show Case Art Category Descriptions

<u>Pencil</u>: This is a drawing on artist paper with pencil only. Shading of various kinds can be used to show values, depth and dimensions. This can be done with regular art pencils, or colored pencils. This can include but is not limited to figure or fashion drawings, still life, landscape, and animals. These drawings, when finished should be sprayed with a fixative to prevent smearing and must be matted and framed.

<u>Pen and Ink:</u> This type of art is usually done on artist paper also but is made using an art pen and ink only. NO other lines of pencil or other media should be seen. These should also have a fixative applied and must be matted and framed.

<u>Pastels or Conte' crayon</u>: There are various kinds of pastels that can be used in this category. Again, this is usually done on artist paper. These are either a <u>chalky type</u> or an <u>oil type</u> pastel kind of crayon and is drawn with , like a crayon, but with much richer colors. These should be fixed to prevent smearing and must be matted or framed.

<u>Watercolor Painting</u>: This type of painting is made specifically using a watercolor paint only and can be fixed to prevent smearing. The pencil lines underneath the painting should either be very faint or non-existent. Should be done on artist watercolor paper and must be matted or framed.

Acrylic Painting: This type of painting can be done on various surfaces such as canvas, heavy watercolor paper, canvas board, and more. Must be matted or framed.

<u>Oil Painting</u>: This type of painting should be done on canvas or a gesso covered heavy watercolor paper. You need to make sure that it has plenty of time to dry before presenting it to display. Framed only – no matt or glass.

<u>Mixed Media:</u> This piece should be done on a canvas, canvas board, or heavy watercolor paper. It is made using any of the above mediums together such as pastels and acrylic paint or watercolor paint with pastels on top. Also another way is to use pencils, color or plain with pastels. This must be matted or framed.

<u>Collage</u>: This type of art is where you can really use your imagination and creativity! Different mediums can be used all together to make this piece of art. Paint, fabric, papers, sand, feathers, beads, buttons, photographs, ephemera, ect... You can use as little or as much as you think you need to make your art piece beautiful. It can also be either a flat piece or art like the paintings or a 3D piece such as a box. It can also be on any type of material such as canvas board, wood, metal, ect... Make sure to develop your pieces so that it shows as a professional piece or art.

Collage hints: "Collage " may sound intimidating, but anyone can put together a fun and interesting collage by just following a few basic tips: Select a great image to showcase. Pick coordinating papers and or paint. Add 3D elements such as tulle, fabric, leaves, or buttons.....

<u>Sculpture:</u> This is a complete 3D piece that can be made from Paper Mache', clay or carved from wood, made of wire or various other materials. It must be able to stand on its own base.

Theme: Project Expo Theme is the "Days of Covid-19".

<u>Note:</u> Some canvasses are made where you do not need to frame them. The sides DO NOT have staples. You must include the side in your painting. They cannot be left unpainted. They can be painted to look like a frame. All art pieces should not be so large that they cannot be hung or displayed efficiently. If you have a concern, please call and ask before you start your piece. 16 x 20 or smaller would be best. All art material that you would need for these pieces can be found at several different art stores, such as Michaels, Hobby Lobby, Voertmans, Art Alley, and more..... you can do research also, on the internet or by visiting art museums.
